COURT PREPARES TO DISMISS TAXPAYER ATTEMPT TO RAID STATE TREASURY

MISSOURI ROUNDTABLE FOR LIFE CREDITED WITH STOPPING IT

JEFFERSON CITY – Representatives of the Missouri Roundtable For Life will be present in the Cole County Circuit Court of Judge Richard Callahan tomorrow at 9:30 am to witness the likely dismissal of a taxpayer lawsuit seeking to bypass the legislature and direct taxpayer dollars for objectionable research. After a year's delay, Attorney General Jay Nixon is moving for dismissal of the case.

The case in question is Thomas Redmond, et al. v. State of Missouri, et al. in which Missouri residents Thomas and Margaret Redmond ask that over \$300,000,000.00 of Missouri taxpayer funds be directed to research including, it appears, embryonic stem cell research. The Redmonds' lawsuit also seeks ongoing funding for research. Their lawsuit has been closely monitored by the Missouri Roundtable For Life and was publicized by the Roundtable last Fall in a detailed research document (available at www.moroundtable.org).

“We published our research document last September precisely because we identified that the Redmonds and Amendment 2 proponents were seeking massive amounts of Missouri tax dollars be spent on objectionable research.” said Fred N. Sauer, a founder of the Missouri Roundtable For Life. “Over 30,000 copies of the research document have been printed and/or distributed here in Missouri. We have been gratified that Missourians have noticed what the Redmonds have been seeking and that the Court seems likely to dismiss the matter.”

During the course of this lawsuit, Rob Monsees of the Missouri Technology Corporation has also been monitoring progress, according to Court records available on Case.Net.

Immediately after the hearing, representatives of the Roundtable For Life will be present to answer press inquiries.
